Timely Recipes

HONIED BAKED APPLES

Choose good firm cooking apples. Wash, dry with a cloth. Remove cores but do not peel. Cut small slits around the apple with a sharp peeling knife, or the prongs of a fork. Place apples in a shallow greased baking dish. Put one teaspoon of honey and one teaspoon of butter in the centre of each cored apple. Add about half a cup of boiling water. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees Fahrenheit) until soft. Base frequently during cooking. Serve hot or chilled.

His Funeral At Kitkatla

Native Village Down Coast Mourns Loss of Charlie Tolmie, Accident Victim.

KITKATLA, Feb. 26: — The funeral of Charlie Tolmie was held on Saturday last and was attended by all natives in the village. The Kitkatla Band, under the leadership of H. Brown, led the funeral procession from Oswald Tolmie's home to St. Peter's Church. The service was conducted by the Rev. B. Shearman, who gave a sympathetic and appealing address to a large congregation of mourners. The hymn "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" was sung and at the close a quartette, "Abide With Me," was rendered by H. Brown, J. Innes, J. Hill and Mrs. E. Nelson. The remains were taken by the seine boat "Quadihaski," accompanied by the "Norma G" over to Graveyard Island, where the body was interred.

On Thursday the body of Tolmie, aged 21, who had passed away in the Prince Rupert General Hospital the preceding day following a gun accident, was brought home to Kitkatla on the seine boat Collinson. The deceased had always been one of the most worthy young men on this reserve and his death was a great shock to all who knew him. Sincere sympathy was expressed in many ways to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Tolmie, his sisters and brothers.
