Whifflets
From The Waterfront

Spring Salmon Run Better This Year — Sockeye Beginning To Show Up—Dogfishing On Islands

Sockeye salmon are now beginning to show up in the Skeena and Naas Rivers, a few having been caught in spring gillnets during the past few days. Meanwhile the number of gillnetters in both rivers is increasing and results of fishing have been fairly satisfactory of late although unfavorable weather this week has caused somewhat of a falling off from a week ago. Boats in the Skeena River last week averaged about 500 pounds for the week with the high boat getting about 2000 pounds. On the Naas River the average was about 1000 pound-per boat for last week. Prices have been quite satisfactory 10c and 8c per pound being paid Naas River gillnetters while the Skeena price of 11c and 6c last week has dropped off to 9c and 5c this week. On the Skeena River at last report 85 gillnetters were fishing and on the Naas some thirty or forty of which three were white men and the balance natives. The number of the boats fishing will probably have increased from these figures during the last few days. Steadily improving runs on the trolling grounds are also reported and, generally speaking, the spring fishing is better this year than it was last. The trollers are receiving 15c per pound for red salmon and 7c for whites.

SUCCUMBS SUDDENLY

Mrs. Fred H. Scott, Formerly Of Usk, Dies In Local Hospital

Mrs. Fred H. Scott, nee Dorothy Daffodil Whitlow, passed away suddenly at 3 o'clock this morning at the Prince Rupert General Hospital. She was twenty-seven years of age.

Mrs. Scott was born at Kitselas Canyon and went to school in Usk and Prince Rupert. She married Frederick Henry Scott of Terrace June 1, 1935.

Besides her husband and four year old son, Barry Francis Frederick, she is survived by her mother, Mrs. E. M. Whitlow, of Prince Rupert, and sister, Mrs. O. B. Sather, of Vancouver.

Funeral arrangements are in the hands of B. C. Undertakers and will be announced later.
