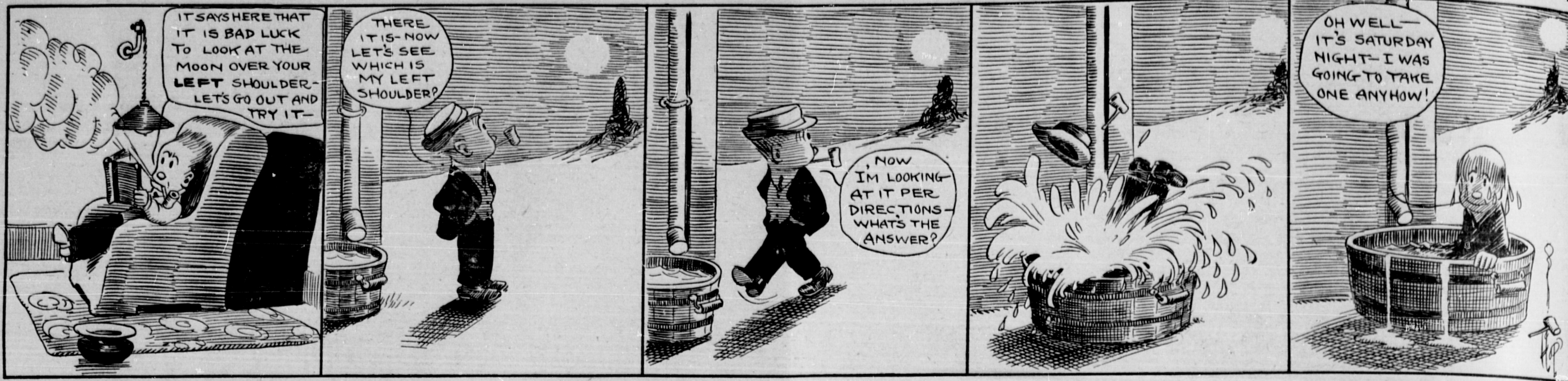

## SIR JOSEPH ON COST OF LIVING

Melbourne, June 4.—Sir Joseph Ward, ex-prime minister of New Zealand, who is at present a visitor to the Commonwealth, advocates closer trade relations between the Dominion and this country. Sir Joseph states that Premier Fisher in conversation told him he was willing to enter into a free trade agreement with New Zealand.

The royal commission appointed to enquire into the high cost of living reports that it finds that the tariff, the present high price of land, the influence of monopolies and labor legislation conduce to increased cost of living throughout the country. The higher standard of comfort demanded by the people also had something to do with it.

## COURT UPHOLDS THE REPORTER

He Refuses to Tell the Source of News and Judge Says He Need Not Betray Confidence.

Milwaukee, Wis., June 4.—A question involving newspapermen and the inviolability of a confidence bestowed in a newspaperman was definitely settled in Milwaukee when a local circuit judge announced that he would refuse to require a reporter to testify as to the source of his information in regard to a news article he wrote.

The case centered about the selection of property for county use. A local paper sent A. T. Abernathy to investigate the situation. His review caused Attorney Henry J. Killilea, former owner of the Boston American Baseball Club, to demand that Abernathy testify as to the source of his information. The demand was refused.
