#### COURT UPHOLDS THE REPORTER

He Refuses to Tell the Source of News and Judge Says He Need Not Betray Confidence.

Milwaukee, Wis., June 4.—A question involving newspapermen and the inviolability of a confidence bestowed in a newspaperman was definitely settled in Milwaukee when a local circuit judge announced that he would refuse to require a reporter to testify as to the source of his information in regard to a news article he wrote.

The case centred about the selection of property for county use. A local paper sent A. T. Abernathy to investigate the situation. His review caused Attorney Henry J. Killilea, former owner of the Boston American Baseball Club, to demand that Abernathy testify as to the source of his information. The demand was refused.
