**A CLOCKERS' CLUB**

They Want to See Only Genuine Records in the Annals

Track and field sport for the next season promises to be enlivened by the advent of a new clockers' club, the plans of which have been discussed by the men really interested in the welfare of athletics and who like to see only genuine records admitted on the athletic annals. The Junior Timers' Club is the title under which the organization will float its banner, and if the report is to be believed a man will have to possess certain qualifications before he is eligible for membership, and all will have to undergo the most searching investigation. No man will be considered except one who has served a lengthy term in connection with active athletics in the capacity of clerk of the course, judge at the finish, scorer, inspector, or some one of the other duties wherein men acquire some knowledge of competition and its vital points.

It is understood that men with good eyesight only need apply for membership and those wearing glasses must satisfy by a test that their vision is good to discern the smoke of a pistol at 100 yards away or more. **THE COMING OLYMPIAD**

Stadium in Sweden Much Smaller than the London Structure

The seating capacity in the new Stadium at the Sweden Olympiad is only 23,000, about a quarter of the extent of the arena used for the London games in 1908, but it must be borne in mind that the Swedish structure is to be permanently used for athletic displays, whereas the London arena has been used only once since 1908. Of the season tickets, about 2,500 are reserved for foreign sale, in the countries competing in the games. The seats reserved for the world's press reach the gigantic total of 500, of which Great Britain will be allotted 40. The stadium is easily accessible from all parts of Stockholm, the tram journey from the center of the city occupying only fifteen minutes. The officials have taken the hotelkeepers in hand and with a view to making things as comfortable for foreign visitors as possible, they have prepared a list of rooms available in the city besides those of the principal hotels. No person on their list is permitted to charge more than \$3 a day, but, of course, the majority are letting at rates much lower than this. The Swedes are taking the game very seriously, and if they do not next a large share of the prizes it will not be through lack of training.

**BETTING IN GERMANY**

A Proposal Has Been Made to License the Bookmaker

There is an agitation in Germany for the licensing of the bookmaker. Without betting it is urged, there can be no racing, and without racing no horse-breeding. The Government has decided that the bookmaker is a criminal, or at least a nuisance, and while it forbids him the race-course, it calls on the public to confine its betting to the totalisator. The reply to this attitude is that at present there are more bookmakers in Germany than ever; that they pursue their trade secretly in cigar shops and drinking bars; that the bettor who is not on the course to invest in the totalisator has no redress if the bookmaker refuses to pay; and that racing authorities must lack the information to improper practices on the part of owners and trainers they would have if they had control over the bookmakers and their books. But the chief loss, it is urged, falls on the State, for while only about \$12,000,000 pass yearly through the totalisator, over \$25,000,000, at a conservative estimate, pass in the form of bets to France and England. Betting on French races is especially popular in Germany, since racing goes on all the year round in France and the amounts bet are much larger than in Germany.
