Timely Recipes

SPANISH STEW

2 lb. veal shoulder or other cut suitable for stewing)
1 onions
1 cup diced celery
1 cup uncooked spaghetti, broken into pieces
2 cups water
2 cups tomato juice
Seasonings
Wipe veal. Remove fat. Cut veal into 1 1/2 inch cubes. Roll meat in flour, brown meat and onion in fat taken from meat. Add water.

Bring to boiling point and simmer 1 1/2 hour. Add remaining ingredients. Season. Simmer 1 hour longer. Thicken with a paste made of flour and water.

Or, she will tell you when she gets around to talking because the daughter of Lieut. Hugh Larrat Henderson, R.C.N.V.R., and Mary Henderson is just recovering from her baptismal.

But she took that like a real tar, according to The Crow's Nest, publication of H.M.C.S. Cornwallis here, which reported the ceremony. It was the first baptism in the naval establishment.

The day of the big event saw the ship's bell from H.M.C.S. Cornwallis filled with sea water from Bedford Basin and placed on a white ensign while Rev. William Hills, R.C.N., performed the ritual.

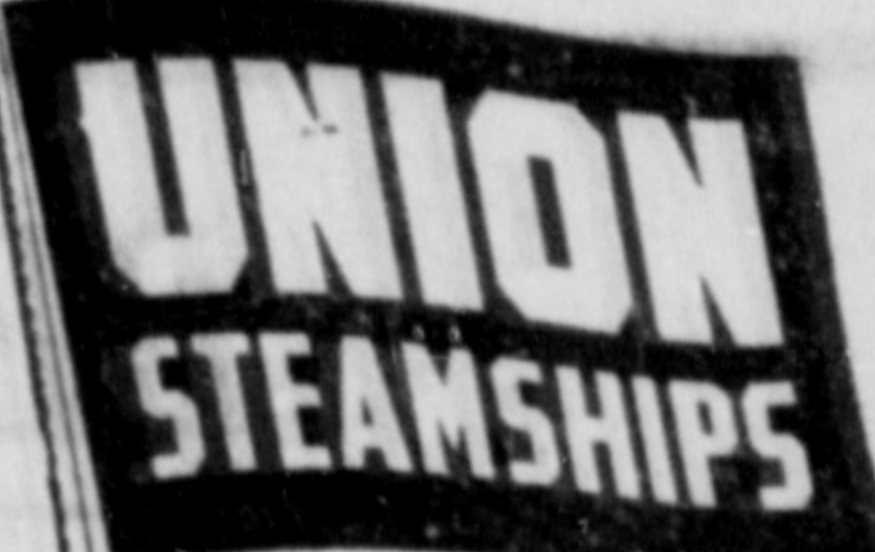
