Would Like To See Barriers All Brought Down

Roosevelt's Son-in-Law Strongly Urges Highway to Alaska.

VANCOUVER, March 6: - One essential factor in the defense of both Canada and the United States is a highway to Alaska.

That is the opinion of the sonin-law of President Franklin D. Roosevelt-John Boettiger, publisher of the Seattle Post Intelligencer. Mr. Boettiger voiced it as he addressed a "Good Neighbor" luncheon of Vancouver business men in Hotel Vancouver. To boost the Victory Loan campaign. the luncheon was sponsored by the Advertising and Sales Bureau and Foreign Trade Bureau of the Board of Trade.

"I think we can agree that Alaska is important to both Canada and the United States," he said. "If we cannot defend the Aleutian Islands and Alaska we are indeed in grave jeopardy.


