Count To Date In Skeena Riding Is 6020 To 2417

One hundred and eight out of 118 polls in the federal manpower plebiscite in Skeena give a result of 6020 in the affirmative to 2417 in the negative, it was announced today by Returning Officer T. W. Brown.

It is announced that the ballot box could not be delivered in time for voting to Telegraph Creek.

Owing to an error in telegraphic transmission, the result from Little Canyon was at first shown to be ten affirmative to twelve negative. The result there was, instead, 10 affirmative and two negative.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah, which has been withdrawn from the Alaska route for a couple of months, will now go to the West Coast of Vancouver Island and Powell River runs for relief duty while the Princess Maquinna and Princess Mary respectively are getting annual overhaul. During the summer the Princess Norah and Princess Louise will operate opposite each other on the Alaska run.

The Jones Act, governing inter-coastal shipping of Alaska, has been amended so that Canadian vessels may henceforth carry passengers from point to point in Alaska. The steamer Princess Norah, which was in port this Tuesday afternoon, was the first boat to handle such traffic both north and southbound.
