# MISS MAY SUTTON ON HOW TO PLAY TENNIS

Former Girl Champion of the United States Gives Useful Hints in a Tennis Talk Interesting to Girls of Prince Rupert

In the April number of American Lawn Tennis there appears an article entitled "Women's Play and How to Improve It," by Miss G. Sutton of Los Angeles, the former woman champion of the United States and England, and who is known to many players in Calgary. Ever since the days of Miss Sutton's advent to championship ability she has been asked to give advice to her sex with relation to the playing of tennis and maintenance of good physical condition.

The article deals with a subject so intricate that probably no one is better able to write on it than Miss Sutton. Her experience in tournament play and the care of her physical self when in preparation for the same has taught her lessons that enable her to counsel her sister aspirants. Her information may be of use to Standard tennis players. She says:

"I have been asked on various occasions to write a few words on the subject of women's play, with special reference to the ways in which members of my sex can improve their game and to touch briefly on the disadvantage we labor under by reason of our femininity.

The request to write such an article reaches me at a time when singular to relate I happen to be in the mood to do so, and I accordingly embrace the opportunity and put my pen on paper. I shall not attempt to go into any phase of the subject at length, but merely set down, perhaps in random fashion, the things that seem to be helpful, useful or interesting.

## California Girls Best Players.

"Let me take first the western girl—she who has the good fortune to dwell in California. The California girl is a better player than the girl from the east or middle west, for she can, if she desires, play the year around. Consequently, she is able to practice much more frequently. It is practice makes perfect. Yet, in spite of their shorter season, there should be more good players among the eastern girls than there are. They have at least five months in the year for practice, and with the determination to learn and improve their game, there is really no reason why they should not become very good indeed.

"Of course the eastern and middle west girls cannot play out of doors in the winter as we can. But this is not altogether a misfortune. A rest from tennis is a good thing and with skating and other winter sports, eastern girls should keep in splendid condition physically. This helps tremendously when the tennis season starts. Here in California we can play right through the year.

"The result is that when spring comes we get a little tired of the game, and are not nearly so keen as we would be if we had been obliged to abstain from playing for a while. On the other hand, we have the winter months in which to practice and this extra practice should and does improve our game.

## Should Enter Tournaments.

"To improve one's game one should enter as many tournaments as possible, as tournament play is the very best kind of practice. Play in tournament even if you get beaten in the first or second round. Each defeat will teach you something and if you need the lesson you will surely improve in the finals. Do not practice when you do not feel keen about playing. To do so will do more harm than good. But when you do practice play for all you are worth and hard all the time. A girl just learning to play should practice with some one not much better than herself. If her opponent is much better her superiority will cause discouragement and the new player will come to think that she does not know anything about the game. Some self-confidence is needed if one is to make real progress.

"If you really enjoy playing you should, with constant practice, improve your game and eventually become a good player. The thing to do, however, is to keep at it continuously and to practice hard.

"In practice games always try to win, of course, but above all things essay new strokes, with the fixed idea of perfecting them. For example, if your backhand is weak, never get out of position in order to make a strike with your forearm, in order to back a strike with your back hand. By

so doing you get out of position, and you are thus at the mercy of your opponent, especially if the next return is a speedy one.

## Women Players Handicapped.

A woman has not the physical strength I think she could play tennis just as well as any man. Of course, a woman is greatly handicapped by her skirts. But if she is in good physical condition and has good strokes she can always give a man a mighty interesting game—even if she gives her a handicap of 50 on every game I think that in the majority of cases the girl would have the better chance of winning.

"In this connection I am thinking of girls who play like Mrs. Chambers, Miss Hotchkiss and Miss Sterry. Thirty on a game is a mighty big handicap for a man to allow, still he is so much stronger, his reach is so much longer, and he is so much more active, etc., that with such a very interesting match would result.

"To sum up, there should be plenty of first class players among the girls all over the United States and Canada, and I hope that all who are really interested in the game will improve tremendously this season. Just play and work hard; be keen and make up your mind to play well. Let us all try to demonstrate that the girls in this country play tennis as well as the girls of any place in the world."
