FEAR FEMALE MAJORITY NOW

Limited Suffrage for Woman in Amendment to be Moved to Asquith's Bill Now Before House of Commons in Motherland.

London, June 14—Premier Asquith announced in the House of Commons yesterday that a franchise reform bill would be introduced at an early date. The bill as drafted, will give one man one vote on a short residential qualification with the simplest possible form of registration, the latter at public expense. The clause fixing all the elections for one day may be added. The official woman suffrage amendment to the bill can not be forthcoming until the bill is printed. There will probably be some limitation regarding women voters. Simple adult suffrage without reference to sex, can not be put forward with any hope of success, since such rumors would give the register, in each constituency, a majority of women. The matter is likely to cause trouble.
