**CLERGYMEN IN CHURCH KILLED**

**Cyclone Wrecks Catholic Cathedral, Laying One Priest Dead at Altar Steps While Administering Sacrament to Another.**

Zanesville, O., June 17.—Three were killed and a score injured when a tornado struck here, toppling the steeple of the St. Thomas Catholic Church through the roof while services were being held. The Rev. F. B. Skinion was struck and killed while administering the sacrament as five hundred of the congregation were fleeing. The Rev. Mr. Roach met his death while administering the last sacraments to Father Skinion, after he had instructed the panic stricken worshippers to leave by the rear door, their lives being imperiled by falling walls.
