### War Puts Crimp In Moonshining

#### Shortage of Metal for Stills and Sugar for Liquor Hits Illicit Industry

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 1 (AP)—Uncle Sam's war-time program of rationing and priorities is putting a crimp in the moonshine liquor business in this and other areas, veteran law-enforcement officers say.

The priority program on metals deprived the moonshiner of copper sheets, from which the best stills are made. The shortage of other metals produces the same result.

But officers believe the sugar rationing program will be an even heavier blow to the illicit liquor manufacturer. The importance of sugar—and plenty of it—to the moonshiner may be seen from the fact that 100 pounds are necessary to make ten gallons of whiskey. Under the rationing program it would take two years or more to save enough sugar from his quota to make a ten-gallon run.
