**NEW TROUT DEVELOPING**

Kamloops Variety, Which Were Recently Planted, Are Thriving And Spreading

SMITHERS, June 10:—Last year the local trout hatchery at Charles Wilson's farm at Lake Kathlyn turned loose 70,000 young Kamloops trout, this being nearly a 100 percent hatch from the eggs received. Young fish had also been hatched there previous to last year and now local nimrods report catching Kamloops trout in other small lakes near here and throughout the Bulkley Valley which apparently first saw the water in Lake Kathlyn. The local hatchery which has been sponsored by the Rod and Gun Club is therefore doing a great service to fishermen as it is restocking all the small lakes with the trout hatched in Lake Kathlyn.

Another 70,000 eggs will be placed in the hatchery again this year and it appears likely that in a few years all the local streams and lakes will offer excellent sport to local fishermen as a result.

**Whifflets From The Waterfront**

Sockeye fishing in this district will open on June 28 which date will mark the commencement of salmon canning operations for 1942. District canneries have now just about completed their preparations for operations. Nelson Bros., Fisheries Ltd., formerly operating on the ocean dock here, has stored its equipment and will not be operating this season.

The Washington Senators lost a close decision to the Cleveland Indians and are now in the basement. The White Sox are in seventh place.

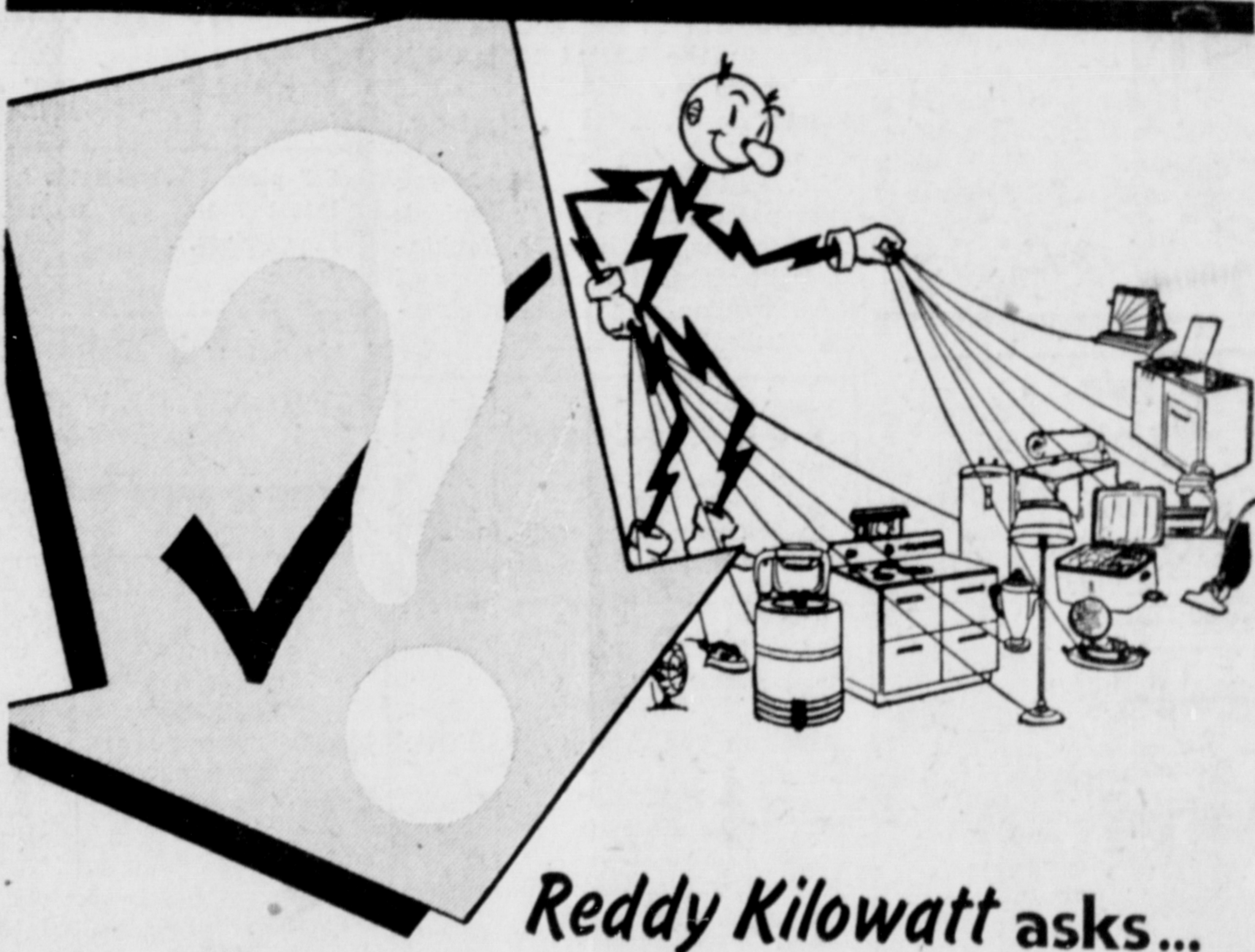
