Total to End of Second Day in Prince Rupert Gets Up to \$154,000 Aggregate

Up to the end of the second day of the Third Victory Loan campaign yesterday the total applications for Prince Rupert had reached \$154,500—a percentage of 28—which is considered quite satisfactory progress toward the \$530,000 objective. Yesterday's applications included some fairly substantial subscriptions but there are many more of these to come. Taken on the whole, the response is considered gratifying enough although the necessity of it being sustained is recognized.
