CHOCOLATE BREAD PUDDING

11/2 squares unsweetened chocolate, cut in pieces

3 cups milk

1/4 teaspoon salt 2 eggs, slightly beaten

l teaspoon vanilla 2 cups stale bread, cut in 1

inch cubes ½ cup sugar

Add chocolate to milk in double boiler and heat. When chocolate is melted, beat with rotary egg beater until blended. Combine sugar, salt and eggs. Add chocolate mixture gradually, stirring vigorously. Add vanilla. Place bread in greased baking dish. Pour mixture over it; let stand 10 minutes, then mix well. Place dish in pan of hot water and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 1 hour, or until firm. Serve with butterscotch hard sauce. Serves
