**Canada's War Chiefs**

MAJ.-GEN. G. R. TURNER  
 Deputy Adjutant and Quartermaster-General  
 1st Canadian Army

(This is the last of a series on Canadian generals at home and abroad)

Most indefatigable senior staff officer in the Canadian army overseas, Maj.-Gen. G. R. Turner lives his work practically around the clock. He's on the job every day and goes back to his desk until the small hours of the morning. It's a routine with him.

When the going is really tough he sets up a bed in his office. Gen. Turner has been working with this even regularity ever since he came overseas with the 1st Canadian Division. He went to 1st Corps and now is at Army Headquarters as "MGA," major-general administration.

Major problems of administration and supply have been handled by Gen. Turner from the time the first contingent set foot on Britain. He never seems to have this big task off his mind. Meet him on manoeuvres in the field and he will start the conversation with: "We have an interesting question of supply here. Now look at this map." And he will outline in minute detail how the field force is being supplied. He thinks right down the line.

A solid, stocky officer, he knows what he wants and make sure he gets it. His stance is that of a wrestler and few men could push him off his feet. Few could make him change his mind once it is made up. He is recognized as a remarkable organizer and a wizard on detail. From the start he has been one of Lt.-Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton's closest advisers.

Born at Four Falls, N. B., General Turner is now 53. He served with the engineers in the First Great War, being decorated with the Military Cross and the Distinguished Conduct Medal. After the war he remained in the permanent force.

He has a grizzled, short-clipped crop of hair and a fine sense of humor. Around Army Headquarters many of the old hands still refer to the general as "the brig," their name for him when he was brigadier, General Staff, at Corps Headquarters.

**Youth Effort Essential to War**

Youth Speaker Outlines Organisation's Program

Speaking at an organization meeting of the Canadian Labor Youth Federation last night Victor Hopwood, B.A., of Vancouver, called on the young people of Prince Rupert to unite in building the forces of victory. More production, a bigger and better army were the essentials; upon these depended the war and upon the outcome of the war the whole future of the youth. He told of how the young people of Great Britain, China and Russia were taking the road to victory by organizing themselves into a mass people's movement aimed at building the army and speeding production. Young people must press for and participate in labor-management committees, must take part in the A.R.P. and other auxiliary defense units. This is a people's war and to be victorious there must be a genuine people's effort behind it.

The organization, he stated, aimed to unite all progressive, anti-fascist youth in a struggle to preserve our national heritage and that this objective can only be realized by winning the war. He declared that lasting peace was possible only under Socialism. The program included strong support for trade unions, especially in their endeavor towards more efficient production.

The meeting was held at 738 Taylor Street.
