Nazi columns pressed toward Kushchevka today as Soviet pubations called on Russian soldiers and civilians for increased sacri-A huge German army of men and machines moved southward Rostov toward Kushchevka, 45 miles to the south, with the parent objectives of seizure of Caucasus oil, neutralization of Red vy bases on the Black Sea and dispatch of forces eastward to instrial Stalingrad. The Germans dropped leaflets over Leningrad ay, declaring they would soon storm the city which has been der siege since last August.

### lies Attack Crete . . .

Allied heavy bombers attacked the vital Axis supply harbor of Bay in Crete yesterday while land operations on the El Alamein ent were confined to patrol activities on the north sector. Heavy mbers took part in the Suda Bay attack. A large Axis merchant in the Ionian Sea was hit.

### Hamburg Battered Again . . .

Hamburg, the greatest German port and most heavily guarded of the Reich, was battered again last night for the second time three nights by the Royal Air Force with a rain of explosive and endiaries in a raid believed to be on a six hundred plane scale. raid cost the Royal Air Force thirty-two bombers.

### Japanese Driven Back . . .

Allied patrols have driven strong Japanese units back from advanced outposts occupied near Kokoda in New Guinea, only sixty es from the most advanced Allied base at Port Moresby.

## PLANT IS WIPED OUT

Queen Charlotte Islands Reported Destroyed by Flames

The well known salmon cannery of the Canadian Fishing Co. at Lagoon Bay in Selwyn Inlet on Moresby Island of the Queen Charlottes has all but been destroyed by fire, according to word reaching Prince Rupert. The fire occurred last Sunday morning and details are lacking as to the nature of the conflagration. It was used to pack fall varieties of salmon and would not be in operation at this time. The loss might be up to \$200,000, depending on the

exact extent of destruction. Ed. Paulson, construction superintendent of the Canadian Fishing Co. from Vancouver, chancing to be here when word was received of the fire at the cannery, left last night for the Islands to ascertain full particulars of the blaze.
