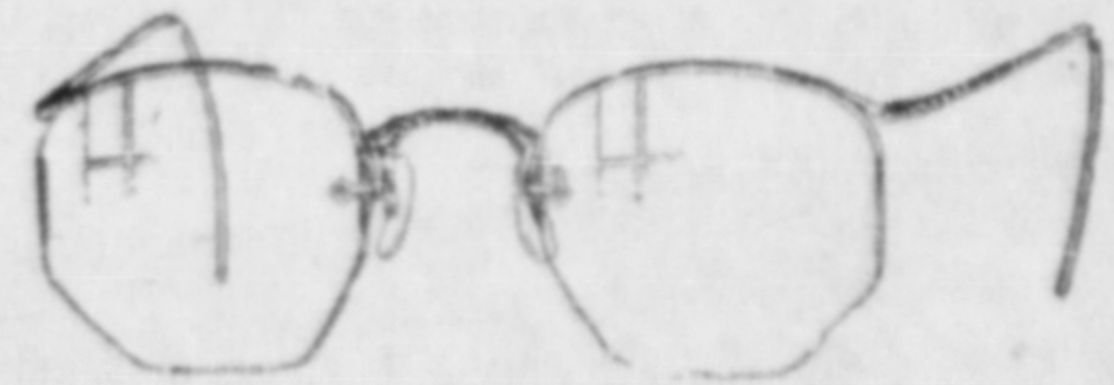

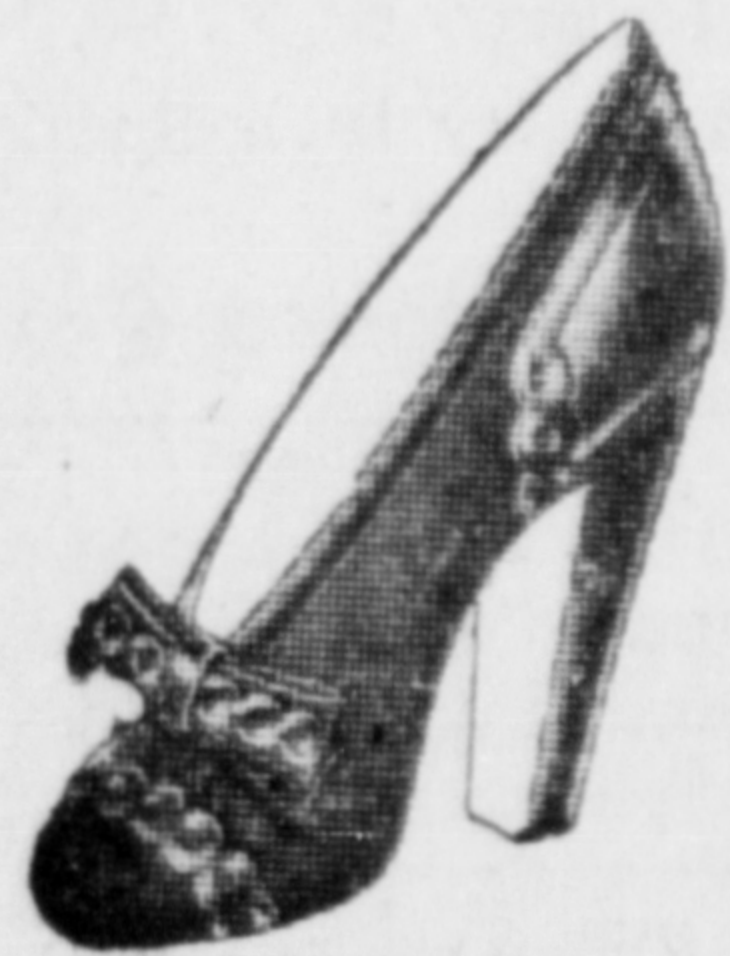

**WAS NOTED
AS JURIST**

Chief Justice Robert Greenshields Of Quebec is Dead

MONTREAL, Sept. 29 — Chief Justice Robert Alfred Ernest Greenshields of Quebec died unexpectedly in Montreal last night. One of Canada's most eminent jurists, his death came as a shock throughout the Dominion. Death was due to a heart attack at the age of seventy-two.

Most young lawyers go through a painful period of waiting before their first client appears, but Robert Alfred Ernest Greenshields stepped out of the room in which he had successfully passed his final examinations not only to a client, but to fame.

Mr. Greenshields passed his oral examination before a committee of lawyers and judges in 1885 in Sherbrooke, Que., and as he came out of the room he heard a telegraph messenger calling his name. A telegram was handed to him and it was an invitation from Charles, later Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Q.C., afterwards minister of justice at Ottawa, inviting him to go to Winnipeg to help in the defence of a very famous prisoner, Louis Reil, who was under arrest after North West Rebellion in which he had played a leading part. Mr. Fitzpatrick was defending Reil and with him were Francois Lemieux, who 44 years later as Sir Francois Lemieux was to be Mr. Justice Greenshields' fellow chief justice in Quebec, and J. A. N. Greenshields, a brother of the fledgling lawyer.

From this auspicious beginning Mr. Greenshields travelled the full length of legal experience, holding various offices in the Bar Association of Montreal and Quebec, until in 1910 he was appointed puisne judge of the Superior Court in Montreal and in 1929 acting chief justice of Quebec, the latter appointment rounding out a career which made him one of the foremost British authorities on criminal law.

Mr. Justice Greenshields was born at Danville, Que., Feb. 2, 1861, the son of John and Margaret Greenshields. He secured his primary education in the Danville schools and at Danville Academy, Richmond, Que. He graduated at McGill University with the degree of B.C.L. from the law faculty in 1885.

Defended Louis Reil

After the Reil trial Mr. Greenshields returned to Montreal and took up the practise of criminal law in association with his brother. In 1889, after he had been appointed Queen's Counsel, he was made crown prosecutor of the Montreal district, but he preferred being on the defence side and resigned af-

ter a short while. For many years, first associated with his brother and afterwards with N. K. Laflamme, K.C., late Senator Laflamme, Mr. Greenshields was called in to defend all the more notorious criminals who were haled before the Quebec courts. One of the most romantic of his clients was McManus, an American who was committed to Devil's Island for robbing the American Express Building in Paris of \$25,000. McManus escaped in a box of cheese, made his way to London and afterwards to Canada. He was convicted of burglary in Ottawa and after serving seven years in the penitentiary at St. Vincent de Paul, Que., was arrested on behalf of the French authorities as he left that institution. Mr. Greenshields was able to prevent his client going back to Devil's Island.

After nine years as puisne judge Mr. Justice Greenshields was appointed a judge of the court of appeal in Montreal. His first task was to bring the calendar of cases in the court of review which was very much in arrears, up to date. He did this with despatch. As an appeal court judge, associated with other English speaking and French speaking judges, he became noted for the soundness of his judgment in criminal and civil cases. Very few of his findings were upset on appeal. During his regime a number of causes celebre came up for decision. One of them was the libel action brought by Madame Rebecca Morin against Le Croix, a Catholic newspaper, for stating her father, the one-time Rev. Charles Chiniquy, had not been legally married because he had been a Catholic priest and had taken the vow of chastity. His lordship found for the plaintiff. He was also a member of the court which rendered judgments on the Hebert-Cloutre and Tremblay-Despatie cases, which involved the right of the courts to validate a church decree annulling marriages. Mr. Justice Greenshields' ruling that such decrees could not be given civil effect was upheld when the cases went to the Imperial privy council maintained his judgment that the provincial statute of 1903 which placed Jews under the protestant school board, was ultra vires of the Quebec legislature.

Public attention was focussed on Judge Greenshields in 1933 when he concluded the trial of James J. Harpell, publisher of the Journal of Commerce, who was charged with and convicted of criminal libel, the plaintiff being Thomas B. Macaulay, president of the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada.

Judge Greenshields became chief justice of Quebec on the death of Sir Francois Lemieux in 1933. Mr. Justice Greenshields was a Liberal in politics and was a great personal friend of the late Sir Wilfrid Laurier. In his younger
