**MEMBERSHIP  
 IN CHURCH**

Interesting Discussion by Rev. J. A. Donnell in First United Church

In First United Church last evening before a large congregation Rev. J. A. Donnell spoke on "The Significance of Church Membership." A special musical number was the impressive rendering of the duet, "Hark, Hark, my Soul," by Dr. and Mrs. R. G. Large.

Mr. Donnell referred to two extreme views sometimes held of what church membership implied. The first one was that it was regarded merely as a "pious matter" of routine. The child was baptized, confirmed when older and later admitted into membership of the church without realizing that there were obligations involved. Some people resented the idea of obligations to the church. Yet these same people accepted readily obligations of social customs and secular organizations. Obligations of a church did not involve loss of freedom.

The other extreme view of church membership was the feeling that it was too awful, too mysterious, for the ordinary person. It could only come as the result of some amazing and miraculous experience, they felt.

Neither view was correct, Mr. Donnell went on. Church membership did not require a stainless or extremely holy state. Christ's teaching was that he came to call sinners to repentance. Church membership did require that the individual would endeavor to follow the way of life as led by Jesus. This meant first of all a sense of God. That the world was not a blind mechanism. It also meant a sense of responsibility to one's fellow man. And thirdly it meant a realization of group relationship. It was not a solitary way of living, not that of a recluse. Jesus lived among his fellow men, the fishermen, the farmers, the housewives, in a free and easy companionship. He did find and make time to commune with God alone and there got the inspiration that made Him the great Saviour of the world. To follow His way as well as humanly possible was real church membership.

**SUGAR  
 Facts**

1. The law sets a ration of 3/4 pound per person per week. This is sufficient for everyone. Additional supplies will be available for home canning and preserving. Sugar prices are under the "Price Ceiling". Hoarding is foolish and unlawful.
2. No home is allowed to have on hand more than two weeks' supply at any time. Retailers are authorized to refuse to sell to anyone they believe to be disobeying the law. Vigorous steps are being taken to punish willful infractions of the law. The penalties provided are imprisonment for as long as two years and a fine of up to \$5,000.
3. Sugar can be saved without hardship by serving simpler desserts, cakes without icings, savoury instead of sweet dishes; by the use of salt, syrup, honey and condensed milk in certain recipes; and by the use of fruits and fruit juices to sweeten puddings.
