Canadian Northern Transcontinental is in Prosperous Shape Financially — Government's \$35,000,000 in the Bank—All Funds Necessary Covered.

Montreal, June 26.—All the financing has been done for the completion of the Canadian Northern from Montreal to the Pacific coast, the \$35,000,000 guaranteed by the Dominion to build the section from Montreal to Port Arthur is in the bank and 7,000 men are at work hurrying forward this stretch to completion. A splendid hotel is to be built in Montreal.

Doherty, his daughter and secretary, Hon. L. P. Pelletier and wife, Hon. R. H. Popen, under secretary of state, and Admiral Kingsmill. Hon. G. E. Foster is already in London.
