DEFENDS HIS JUICE PLANT

Supt. Matthews Complains That Some One Has Been Disparaging His Power Producing Machinery.

In one of his well known and expressive reports the other night City Light Plant Superintendent Matthews represented to the Council that complaints made regarding the power supply from the plant, which had come in from a planing mill, and other power users, were not altogether justified, and stated further that the letters of complaint received showed symptoms of having been written by the same person. He defended his plant, stating that it was in every way efficient, and suggested that there exists antagonism to the city's own juice producer for interested reasons. The report was adopted by the Council.

IMMIGRATION STATISTICS

Important New Work of Reference Just Published by the Department at Ottawa—Interesting Figures and Comparisons

Ottawa, June 27—The immigration branch of the Department of the Interior has issued a pamphlet entitled "Immigration Facts and Figures" which contains facts and figures for the last fifteen years. During the last eleven and three quarter years 2,418,712 immigrants came to Canada, apportioned as follows:

Maritime Provinces, 89,474.
Quebec, 309,422.
Ontario, 504,429.
Manitoba, 353,100.
Alberta and Saskatchewan, 608,965.
British Columbia, 204,414.
Not shown, 13,221.

Of these 832,188 were British, 752,420 from the United States, and 543,401 from continental countries.
