CHEMISTRY HELPS TO WIN THE WAR

**Bird's Eye View  
 of Berlin**

AS the R.C.A.F. bomber pilot swings his plane around over Berlin, he sees clearly the details of his target below him through a windshield of plastic material—"Lucite". For this moment of "chickens coming home to roost", a crew of bright faced Canadian lads became avengers of the skies, an infant Canadian aircraft industry grew up overnight, and a product of Industrial Chemistry went to war.

"Lucite" is one of a group of many new materials generally referred to as Plastics. It is transparent as crystal, but is only half the weight of glass. But—vital in aircraft use—it will not shatter like glass.
