Miss Dorcas Prevost Becomes Bride Of Robert Nelson Jr. At Cathedral Ceremony

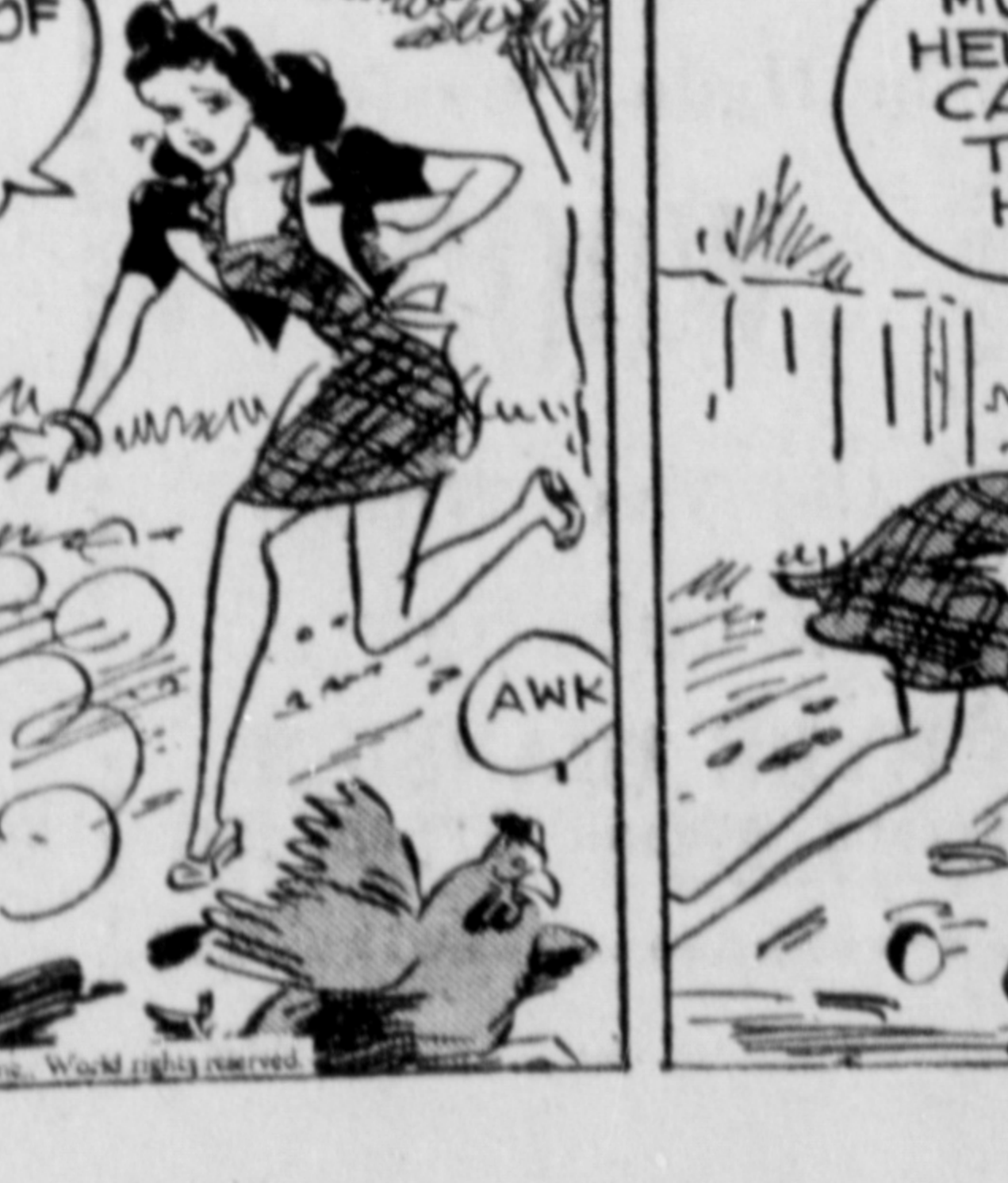
