### Ranger Officer At Rotary Club

Constant Vigil Maintained by Coast Rangers—Will Co-operate With Regular Army

Speaking at the Rotary Club luncheon Capt. B. T. O'Grady, field supervisor of the Pacific Coast Militia Rangers pointed out that the organization would be an important auxiliary to the Active Service Force in the event of any full-scale invasion of this coast. Its members are men who are thoroughly acquainted with the coast terrain and who are used to living in the woods. In remote settlements, where there is no active force station, it is the duty of the Rangers to prevent small-scale landings, to be informed of the movements of all suspicious persons or craft and to maintain a watch for the work of fifth columnist or saboteur.

The Rangers are being equipped with uniform and arms suitable to their type of work. The Sten sub-machine gun will be prominent in the armament of the force. It is light, all metal, of simple construction and few parts and is being mass produced at a cost of only nine dollars each.

While the organization is informal in character, training will be taken in signalling, musketry and most important of all guerrilla tactics. Except in case of emergency membership does not interfere with civilian occupations. Membership is open only to those not eligible for the Active Service Force.
