**Timely Recipes**

**CHOCOLATE FROSTING**

You needn't give up the cherished custom of celebrating the juvenile birthday with a cake. Just make cake layers from a sugarless or low-sugar recipe and frost them with chocolate frosting made of condensed milk. This recipe can be whisked together in five minutes, requires no sugar. The cake will draw special exclamations of delight from the youngsters if it is inscribed with birthday greetings spelled out with half peanuts and arranged a triumphal procession of peanut men and animals around it. Make legs and arms of pipe stem cleaners, thrust through peanut bodies with a substantial twist of the wire for feet, and mark the features with paint or a pencil.

2 squares unsweetened chocolate.

1 1-3 cups (1 can) condensed milk.

1 tablespoon water.

Melt chocolate in top of double boiler. Add sweetened condensed milk. Stir over boiling water 5 minutes until mixture thickens. Add water. Cool. Spread on cold cake. This frosting covers tops of 2 (9-inch) layers, or top and sides of loaf cake generously, or about 24 cup cakes.
