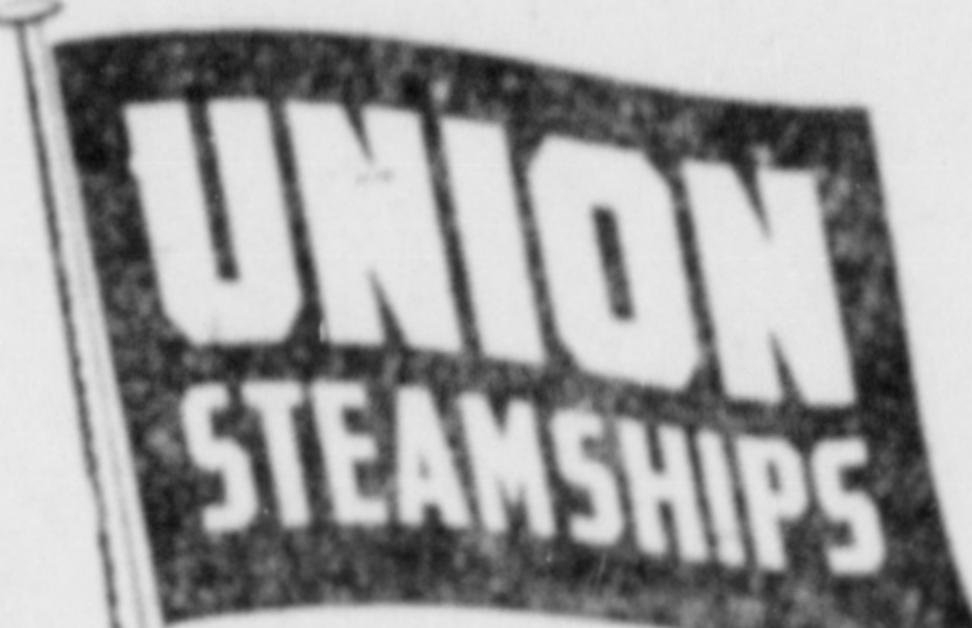

Revenue for this calendar year to date has reached a total of \$483,085.35 as against \$475,907.11 up to a corresponding period of last year.
