Interesting and Timely Talk Before Prince Rupert Rotary Club Yesterday by Roy Van der sluis.

Of particularly timely interest was Mr. Van der sluis' description of Port Darwin and northern Australia which is so much in the limelight today on account of the war in the southern Pacific. At the time Mr. Van der sluis was at Port Darwin it was a quiet little port, its sole activity being in connection with a meat shipping plant. The speaker told how cattle abounded on the great grazing areas of that country. Obtaining of water often presented a problem the answer to which was artesian wells.

BEERY HAS TYPE ROLE

Cast as Hard-Boiled Sergeant With Heart of Gold in "The Bugle Sounds."

Wallace Beery is typically cast as a tough sergeant with a heart of gold in "The Bugle Sounds," story of the new mechanized army forces, which is the feature for this Friday and Saturday at the Capitol Theatre here.

With a record of twenty-nine years in the service, Beery is thoroughly disgusted when horses are abandoned in favor of tanks. His colonel and friend, Lewis Stone, attempts to pacify him but the sergeant balks until a court-martial's discharge is meted out to him. When they plan to wreck a shipment of tanks he captures them and is rewarded with new honor medals for the collection he already has.

Marjorie Main appears opposite Beery and adds humor as the proprietress of a soldier beanery just beyond the reservation.

Others in supporting roles are Donna Reed, William Lundigan, George Bancroft, Henry O'Neill, Chill Willis, Tom Dugan and Guinn Williams.


