**SUGARLESS CAKE**

2 1/4 cups sifted cake flour.  
2 1/4 teaspoons baking powder.  
1/4 teaspoon salt.  
1/2 cup butter or other shortening.  
2 teaspoons grated orange rind.  
1 cup light corn syrup.  
2 eggs, unbeaten.  
1/2 cup milk.  
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla.  
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream shortening with orange rind; add syrup gradually, beating well after each addition. Add 1/4 of flour and beat until smooth and well blended. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each. Add remaining flour in thirds, alternately with milk in halves, beating very well after each addition. For best results, beat cake very well at each stage of mixing. Add vanilla. Bake in two greased 8-inch layer pans in moderate oven (375 Ft.) 30 minutes, or until done.

The fish was quickly taken up by the local retail trade. Up to early this afternoon, no fresh halibut had been landed following the opening of the season at midnight last night.
