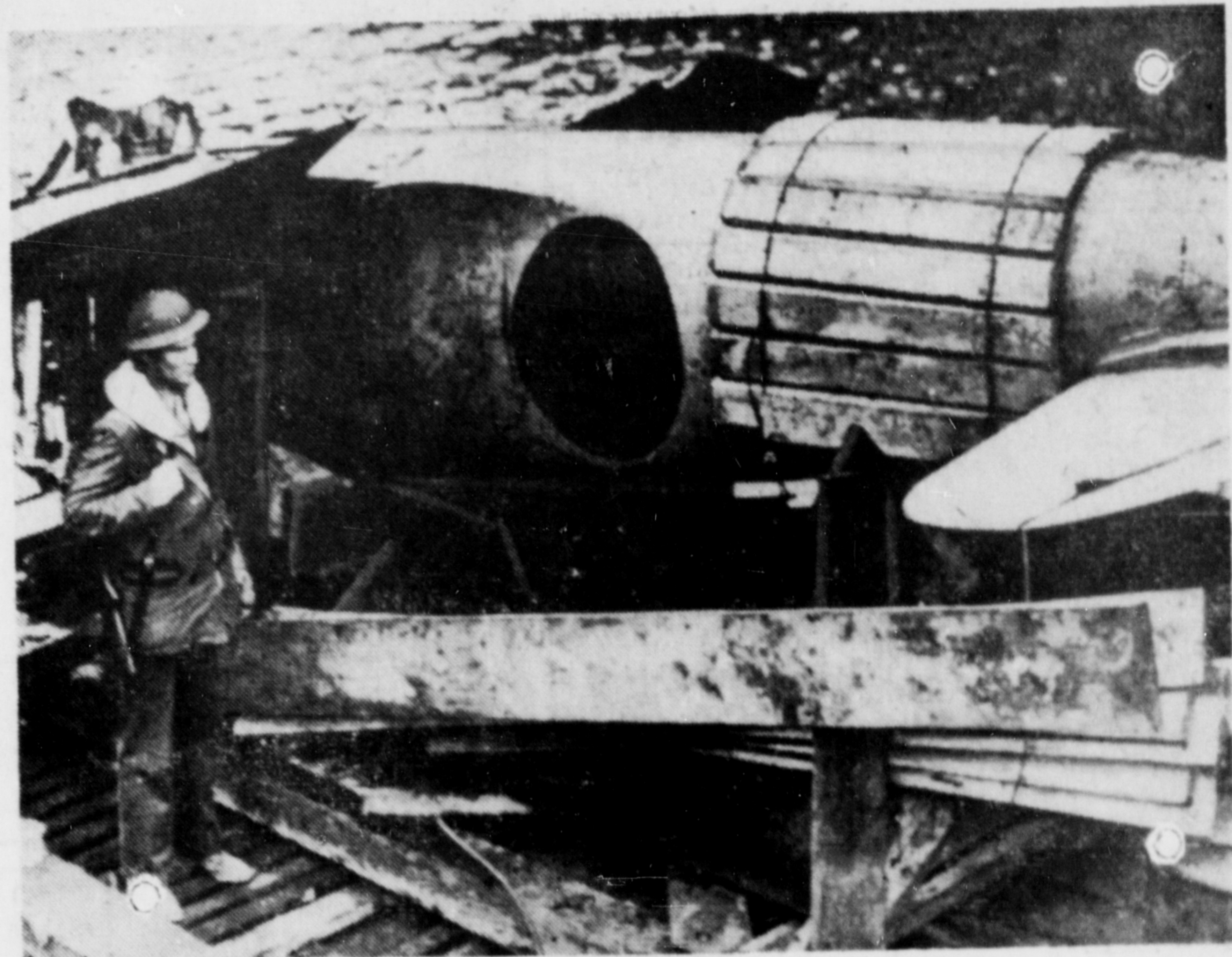

The Y.M.C.A. staff has expanded from three to a dozen and this area, now centralized in Prince Rupert, is known as the Northern B.C. Area. The three forces are serviced with sports equipment, small games, cards, books and magazines and one man alone is detailed to meet all ships and supply their needs as they berth for a few days.

The canteen has grown to such proportions that it now requires a full time manager with two paid helpers and a regular system of volunteer help.

The Y.W.C.A. hostess' work has grown proportionately with the increase in the Y.M.C.A. activities because, in this co-operative effort of ours, the dividing line between where one activity begins and the other ends is so slight as to be almost non-existent.

The Searchlights Auxiliary and the Navy and R.C.A.F. Women's Club meet regularly and all during the winter fortnightly whist drives were held for the service wives.

The greatly increased number of regimental dances keeps hostesses and chaperones busy. We are indeed grateful for the support and the co-operation given us by the citizens of Prince Rupert and I, for one, having been here a year and made many personal friends, feel like a native daughter. It's been a wonderfully full and happy year.
