## Beefsteak and Kidney Pie

A nutritionally valuable dish you can prepare the day before and complete in 30 minutes the next day

Busy wartime housewives are coming more and more to ask for recipes that permit pre-preparation. It's a great comfort to know-when you to smooth consistency with cold come home late from the Red Cross, liquid. Transfer to baking dish. Now here's what you do the evening before to make all this possible: Soak a veal or beef kidney in cold salted water for 30 minutes. Meanwhile, cut 1 lb. (or as much as you can spare from your ration) of beef chuck or round steak into neat pieces. Slice an onion and brown slowly in saved meat dripping or lard. Now drain the kidney, remove tubes and membranes and cut into 1/2-inch

cubes. Add meats to the browning onion and brown well on all sides. Cover with boiling water or stock. Add 1 teaspoon Worcester Saucepinch of thyme, savoury, marjoram or poultry dressing—salt and pepper. Simmer covered for two hours. Thicken liquid with flour blended

> EASY FLAKY PASTE FOR MARTHA LOGAN'S BEEFSTEAK AND KIDNEY PIE

31/2 cups sifted all purpose flour 11/4 tsp. salt 36 cup Jewel Shortening Ice-cold water

Measure flour and sift with salt. Cut in Tewel, using 2 knives, or a pastry blender, until pieces are reduced to size of large peas. Gradually add suffi when lightly mixed, may be cleaned easily from bowl. Chill. Roll dough to about 1/4" thickness. Fold from top to bottom and from left to right. Repeat rolling and folding. Roll and use.
