Timely Recipes

ROSE HIP JAM Cover hips with boiling water and simmer until tender; rub through sieve. To each pound of pulp, add three-quarters pound of sugar, boil rapidly, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking, until the mixture falls from spoon in sheet.

Note: a better consistency will be obtained if one part commercial pectin is added to each two pounds of pulp.
