**Sandwich Secrets**

**Sandwiches should be good eating, and good health builders**

**SANDWICH SPREADS**

Add ingredients in each case to ¼ cup softened butter.

- MUSTARD BUTTER  
Use prepared mustard to taste
- CHILI BUTTER  
Use 2 tbs. chili sauce
- ONION BUTTER  
Use 1 tsp. finely minced onion or chive
- PARSLEY BUTTER  
Use 2 tbs. minced parsley, 1 tsp. lemon juice
