Ilse Kraupner was the first number on the program. Tapping her way into the hearts of the boys she looked very pretty in a gay red blouse, scarlet sash and blue slacks. Ilse's costumes are always smart and cleverly designed.

Lieutenant Patrick, who is back from overseas and who was in an army troupe playing the London theatres while there gave one of Stan Holloway's imitable sketches in north country dialect. This time it was the tale of Sam and the Flood. Lieutenant Patrick is a grand performer and we look forward to more of his character sketches. I hope, however, he will use the mike. It's very hard to hear at the back of the theatre and what he has to say is certainly worth hearing.

Agnes Grant, who was on an earlier Carl Clay program and who has a sweet voice, sang several popular ballad numbers. Pat and Jim next entertained in an attractive dance routine accompanied at the piano by Mrs. J. S. Black. Pat, is you know, is Pat Love and Jim is Sergeant Major Jim McCague.

This was followed by two violin solos by a real artist, Bom-

bardier Yack Nicki, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Smith. Yack succeeded in doing what a great many performers find most difficult, that is he held his services audience spellbound with his playing of strictly classical music. And well he might, for we have not had such a treat in months, if ever. His playing of the spirited "Czardas" and Dvorak's beautiful "The Song My Mother Taught Me" lives in the memory. Mrs. Smith's accompaniment was perfect.

Piquante Marie Boutler came out in an amusing character tap dance. Marie has a real flair for comedy and should be encouraged to develop this angle of her talents.

Carl Clay, under whose direction this concert took place, gave a comical wedding ceremony skit, a take-off on the troubles of a navy wife. His assistants in this act were Agnes Grant and Sailor Wilkinson. Lieutenant Patrick followed this up with a very funny clerical monologue.

The concert was varied and good entertainment all the way through.

The meet, which was strictly an Army show, assisted by the Y.M.C.A., was a preliminary to the Pacific Command track and field meet to be held in Victoria on November 17 and which an as yet undetermined number of local winners will attend.
