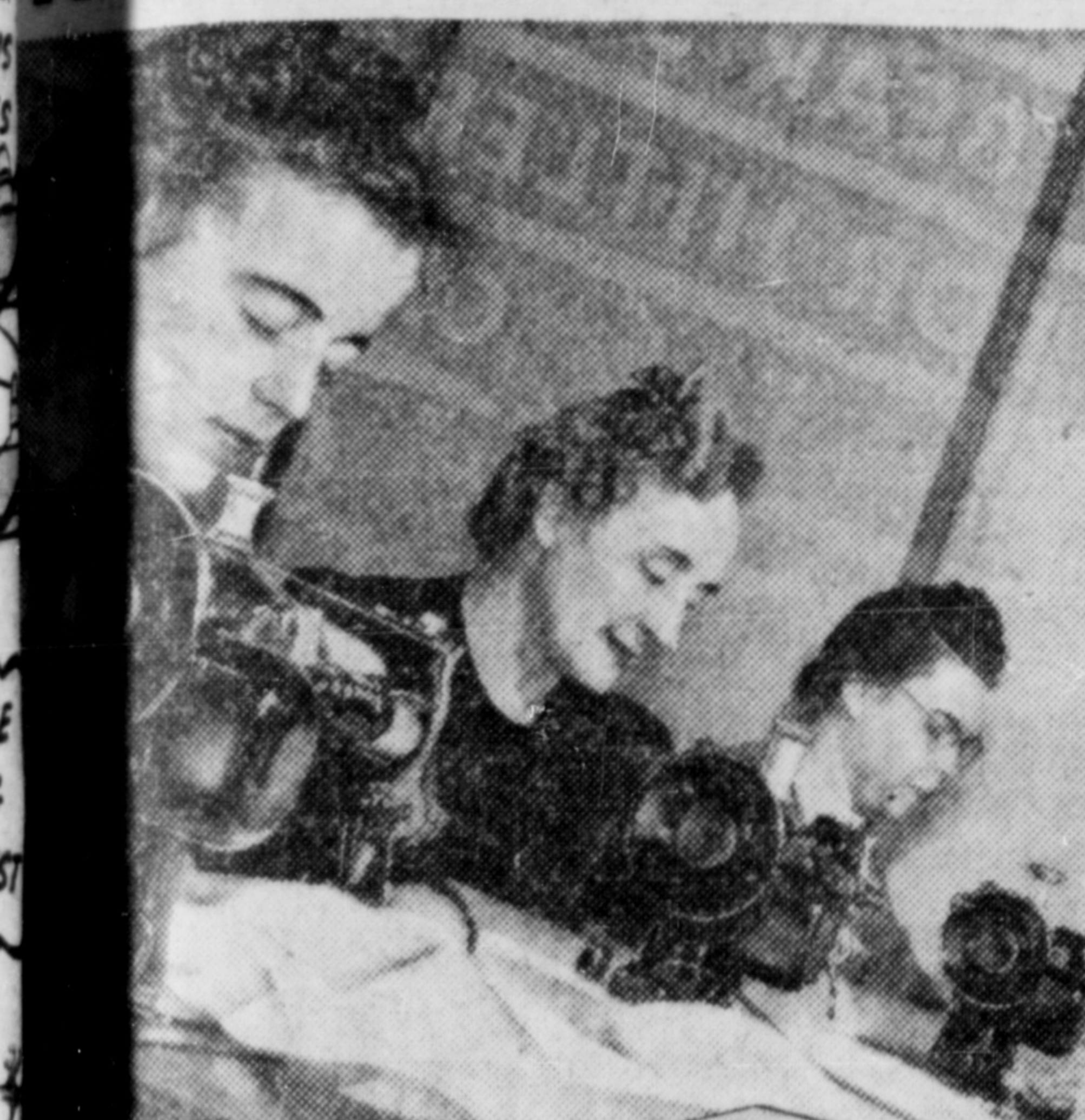

Opening interest in connection with Prince Rupert's 1943 Civic Centre Carnival will centre in the inauguration of the campaign which will culminate in the selection of the glamor queen for the year who will hold sway over the carnival with all the honors and formalities attendant to the occasion. Nominations are now being received by the carnival queen committee consisting of Stanley Saville and Maurice Bridges.

During the next few days the services and local organizations will be getting their girl friends into the running, with the promise of support as enthusiastic and energetic as that of last year when the contest was an event of such general interest.

To make the campaign even more attractive this year the prizes are substantially greater than last year.
