Complaint has been made to the city of an itinerant photographer making the rounds of the town without a licence.

In view of dim-out conditions now imposed, Ald. George Hills suggested to the city council Monday night that it might prove a helpful safety measure to put a coat of light paint on main traffic bridges such as Hays Creek and Westview.
