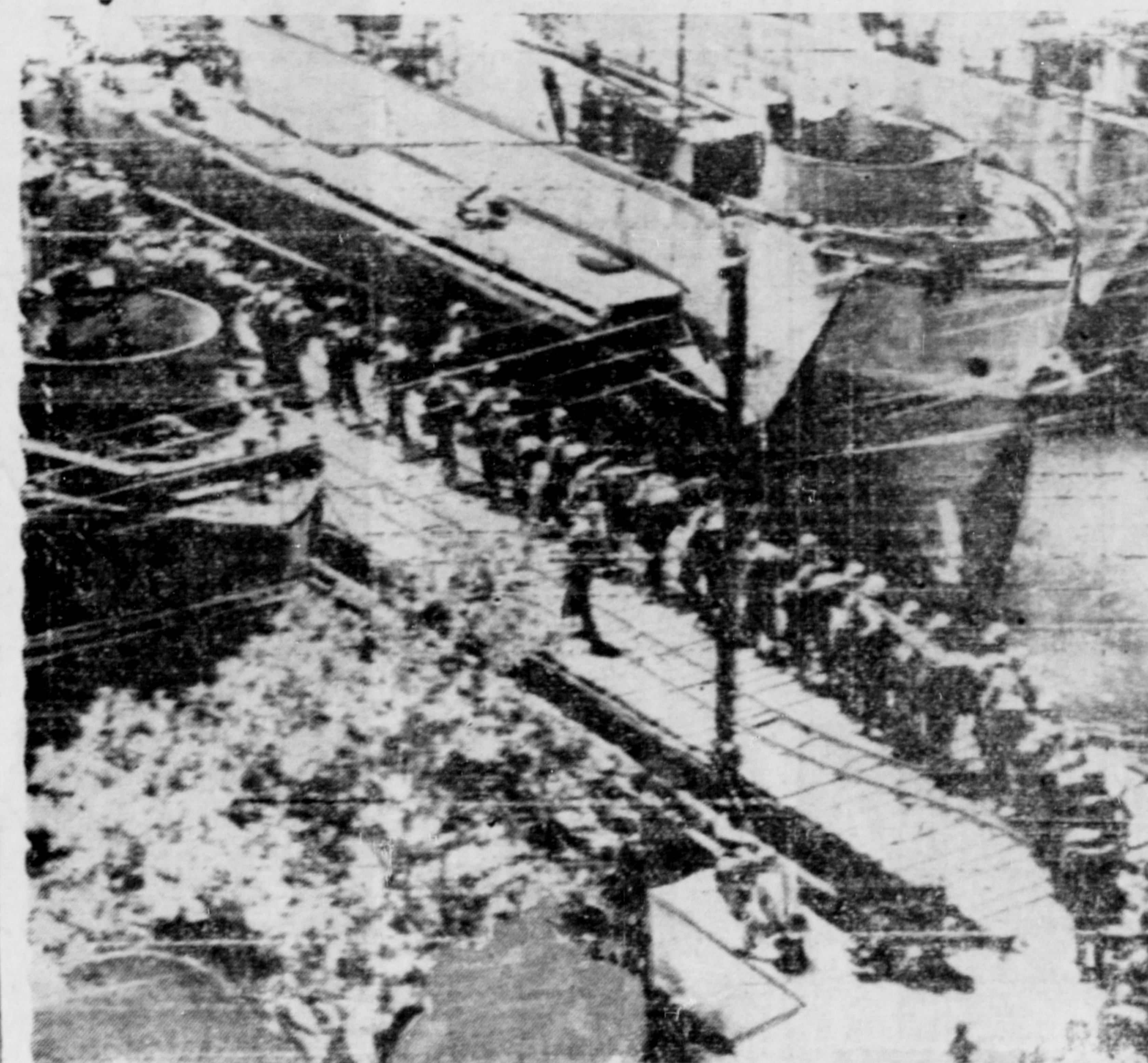

AS ALLIES INVADED SICILY



Loaded to the gunwales with especially-trained amphibious shock troops, one of the great fleet of Allied invasion barges that participated in the invasion of Sicily, is shown in this radio photo, pulling out from a North African port. The men are waving a "so long" to their comrades, who were due to follow in their turn. Landings were made on Italy's island bastion at 3:00 a.m., July 10, under an umbrella of warplanes and a great naval and air bombardment that hammered Axis positions for a depth of 10 miles inland.

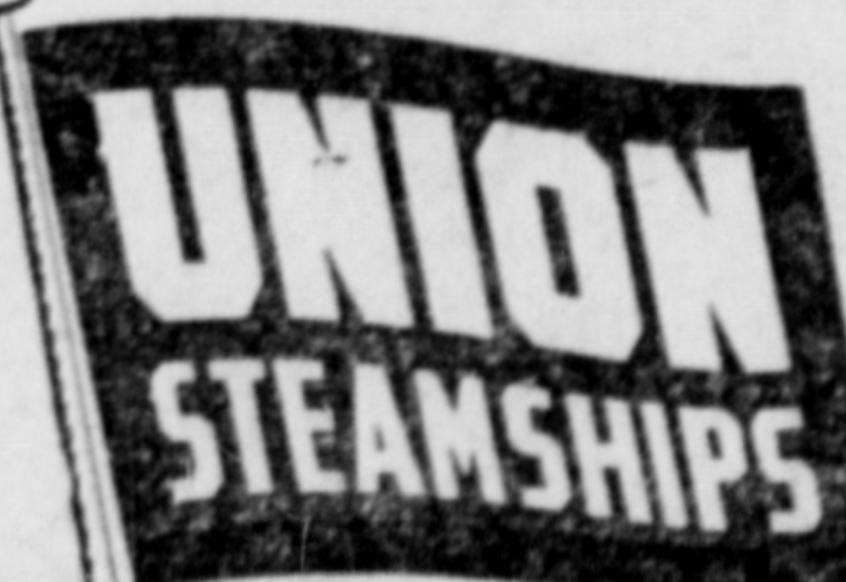
