

Yanks Outshine
All Stars 4-3

Good Crowd Turns Out to See
Labor Day Baseball at
Acropolis

About a thousand baseball fans in the stands at the Acropolis grounds yesterday afternoon witnessed a battle between the Yanks and the Prince Rupert All Stars in which the Yanks took the decision by the slender margin of 4-3 over the home team.

No score was recorded up to the fourth inning, during which the Yanks took a one-run lead when Cpl. Fernandez came in on a fielder's error.

However, the All Stars surged ahead in the first part of the fifth, when Dido Gurvich and Arnie came home on a single by McNab.

In the second part of the fifth the Yanks pulled into a one-run lead again when Fernandez and Moore crossed the plate following a series of in-field errors by the All Stars which started with a bad throw from the pitcher to first base.

In the sixth, Player-manager Bill Lambie hit a double which brought in the third All Star counter on a single by Gurvich.

Kearney came in with the winning run for the Yanks in their half of the seventh, after a double of Munro.

Real stars of the game were the pitchers of both teams who pulled their teams out of holes caused by fielding errors, and squelched runners on third time and again.

Manager of the Yanks was Lt. Leo Paddenn, and coach was M. Sgt. "Nipper" Welch, and manager for the All Stars was Bill Lambie.

John Comadina and Harry Dietch were umpires.

LUNCHEON

At noon yesterday the Governor General, the Earl of Athlone, and Her Royal Highness Princess Alice were guests of the commanding officers and officers of the allied services here at a luncheon in the naval drill hall where officers of all the services were in attendance.

Her Royal Highness wore the uniform of an air commodore of the W.A.A.F.'s. She was accompanied by Mrs. R. H. Foss, wife of Group Captain Foss R. C.A.F.

Col. D. B. Martyn accompanied His Excellency and General Nelson Ganong, commanding officer of the Eighth Division, was also present.

There were no formalities other than the meal, no speeches being made. Major Marrant, area chaplain, asked the blessing.

The menu consisted of tomato juice cocktail, celery hearts, cold roast beef, baked ham, roast veal, jellied tongue, potato salad, head lettuce, mayonnaise, sliced tomato, vanilla ice cream, fruit sauce, rolls and coffee.

Baseball Wife
Steers Hubby
Into Big Time

FORT WORTH, Tex. Sept. 7.—Mrs. Hank Oana probably is the only baseball wife in history who manoeuvred her husband from the minors to the big leagues. She worked the deal through accident but nevertheless deserves full credit.

It all started with a postcard. It said Oana would be called for a physical examination soon to see whether he would be re-classified.

Mrs. Oana took one look, and said to herself: "Oh oh! He's in 1-A."

Hurriedly she sent a wire to Hank, then pitching for Milwaukee of the American Association. Milwaukee had bought him from the Fort Worth Club of the suspended Texas League, paying \$500 down.

Hank showed the telegram to Bill Veck, Milwaukee boss. The contract between Fort Worth and Oana, provided that if Hank was re-classified by a certain time, Milwaukee wouldn't have to pay an additional \$4,500 for him.

The Brewers didn't want to buy a ball player who was about (Veck thought) to be drafted, so he notified Fort Worth he was returning Hank. The Cats were not operating, so Oana automatically became a free agent. Detroit snapped him up and he's now pitching and pinch-hitting for the Tigers.

When his real status was determined it was too late to take him away from the Tigers and Milwaukee had to pay Fort Worth.

Wild Bull Firpo
Has Heavy Dream

BUENOS AIRES, Sept. 7.—Fat, 47, Luis Angel Firpo, still dreams of bringing to Argentina the world's heavyweight title he had in his grasp 20 years ago when he drove Jack Dempsey sprawling through the ropes only to lose his title bid in the second round when the rugged champion rallied to knock him out.

Firpo's dream rests its hopes on the strong fists and broad shoulders of a 230-pound farmer boy who is being groomed for an early debut in the United States.

The 6-foot 5-inch Cestac, who is 23, has been boxing three years as an amateur without losing a fight. He has won 54 bouts.
