**The Civic Election . . .**

Prince Rupert will have its civic election tomorrow. For the principal offices of mayor and aldermen an adequate choice of candidates is offered. The field falls into two groups—the candidates sponsored by the Civic Labor Federation on the one hand and the more or less loosely associated Independents on the other.

There may have been some matters introduced into the campaign which could be classed as issues but the fact of the matter is that civic government will be, during the coming year as it has been in the past, largely a matter of expediency, carrying on in the best interests of the city under circumstances over which there will be largely no local control.

With no major questions of general policy likely to arise, it resolves itself down largely to a matter of administration and dispensation of available resources. This being the case, it might be well to suggest the importance of a careful individual selection on the part of the voters from among the candidates. Whether one group or another should be in control would appear to be a matter of quite secondary importance.

The voters tomorrow might be well advised in considering the personal talents and qualifications of the candidates irrespective of whether they come with the blessing of one faction or another.

There would appear to be plenty of able candidates. It is up to the voters to determine whom they consider the best and vote accordingly, having in mind the best interests of the city.

It is to be hoped that there will be a free and full expression of preferences brought about through the exercise of the privilege and duty of the franchise. It is good citizenship to turn out and vote.

**GREAT ARMY SHOW HERE**

Irving Berlin Spectacle Being Featured at Capitol Theatre For Rest of This Week.

Irving Berlin's "This is the Army," which successfully stormed city after city in its original stage version and has been no less a success as a film spectacle, comes to the screen of the Capitol Theatre here tomorrow and will continue Friday and Saturday. Produced in technicolor, the film version uses all the original cast plus Sergeant Joe Louis, world's heavyweight boxing champion, as well as a large cast of moving picture and radio stars with some old and some new Irving Berlin songs. Hollywood is well represented by such favorites as George Murphy, Joan Leslie, Ronald Reagan, George Tobias, Alan Hale, Charles Butterworth and Una Merkel. Radio's great star, Kate Smith, sings "God Bless America," which she introduced over the air; Frances Langford puts over the new number "What Does He Look Like?" and Gertrude Nissen sings some of the World War No. 1 tunes.

A screen story has been built around the show, linking together the generations of the two world wars and giving the production a plot interest which the stage version lacked.

A generous portion of the proceeds of the showings of "This is the Army" goes to the Canadian Army show and recreation fund.
