LONDON, Oct. 14 — The modern woman, says Dr. Edith Summerskill, well known M.P., "is a different proposition from her grandmother"—she looks upon childbirth as a more important matter than her grandmother.

"She feels she has a great responsibility towards her child and I am sure that the population will continue to decline until there is adequate accommodation for an expectant mother." Dr. Summerskill told a recent meeting. She emphasized the need for more facilities for rest for mothers both before and after their children were born.
