Timely Recipes

COCOA OATMEAL COOKIES

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour or 1 1/2 cups pastry flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup cocoa
3/4 cup sugar
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
1/2 cup mild-flavored, melted drippings
2 cups fine rolled oats

Sift dry ingredients. Combine beaten egg, milk, vanilla and melted fat; add to dry ingredients and mix thoroughly. Add rolled oats, blending well. Drop by teaspoons on a lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F., for 15 to 20 minutes. Makes 4 1/2 dozen cookies.
