WITH THE EIGHTH ARMY IN ITALY, Nov. 25 —Silly as it may sound, there are officers with the Canadians in Italy who are performing serious and important work though they are known among the troops as "fos."

Every unit, in telling about one operation or another, invariably mentions "fos" or a "foo" who has performed a vital job effectively despite hazards.

"Foo" is short for Forward Observation Officer, a man who operates well forward, often exposed to enemy fire and from observation posts report results of artillery fire back to the guns.
