Sport Chat

A publisher who holds interests in no fewer than 85 different activities, Walter Hutchinson, added another purchase in the Manor Stud, a Hampshire estate steeped in British turf history. The stud comprises 100 acres and was purchased for "five figures." Hutchinson, who raced on a large scale before the war, intends to resume in the near future and is "keen on breeding staying blood." He will bring some horses from Eire. "There is room for between 30 and 40 horses at the stud and apart from training I shall breed on a large scale," he said. Oddities surrounded Hutchinson's pre-war activities. At one time he had 31 horses in training and when Broad Oaks won the Autumn Cup at Alexandra Park in 1938 the publisher caused a sensation by giving away a handful of banknotes. He also owned Ballyscalon, a steeplechaser who was at his best only when his jockey carried a rattle attached to his whip. The ruling body of Jockey Club stewards eventually banned the practice. Hutchinson won more than \$45,000 on Ballyscalon during his career. He bought the chaser at auction, entered him in a race the following day. Hutchinson made a large wager on his entry which

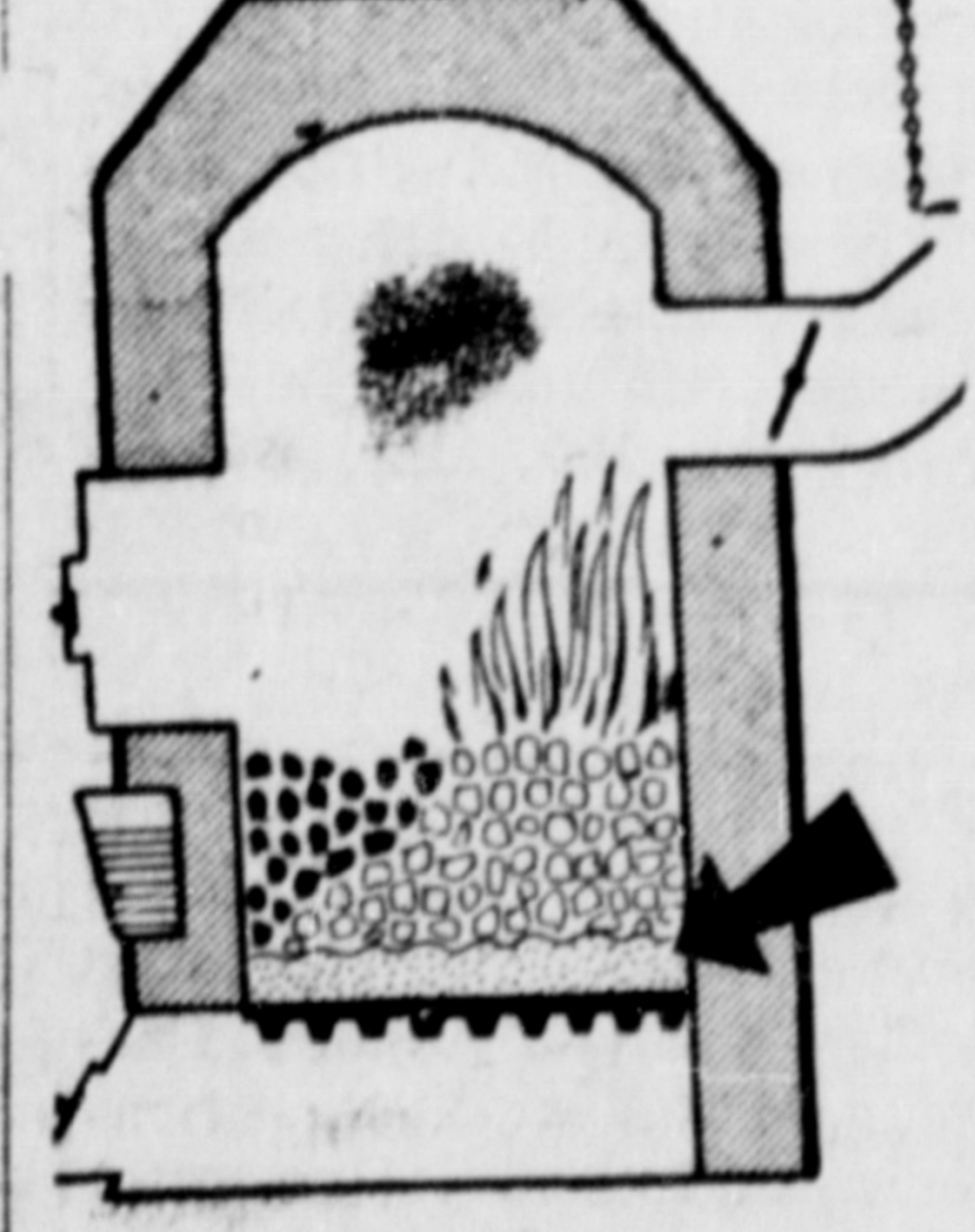

won sensationally at odds of 63-1. The publisher's main race hopes revolve around breeding a winner of the Grand National. His last entry in that class was Tapionis in 1937 which fell during the running.

There was plenty of celebrating—for some—up Stockton way when Screech pounded to an easy, two-length triumph in the seven furlong Tees Handicap. The little betterers—those fellows who lay a couple of bob—received nearly \$33 for every 45 cents they bet. That represents odds of more than 72 to one.

Royal Glory, four-year-old winner of the \$4,400 Northern Cambridgeshire at Stockton, was a gift horse which narrowly missed being destroyed. Owned and trained by Matt Peacock, one of England's most successful trainers, Royal Glory previously was the property of J. G. Thompson who bought him for \$5,525. Thompson became so discouraged with the poor performances of the racer, he told Trainer Peacock to have him shot. Peacock demurred and Thompson then sided his trainer take the racer as a gift.

Keeping up the high prices being paid for yearlings with a view to post-war racing, a filly was bought at a Dublin bloodstock sale for the equivalent of \$11,575. Purchased by Trainer Tom Hall, the animal is a half-sister to Diplomat, which won stakes on successive days at Ascot in 1937 and more than \$45,000 in stakes. Another filly was purchased by the Hon. Dorothy Paget, millionaire racehorse owner and breeder, for nearly \$10,000.
