SPORT CHAT

The outstanding leather-pushers of the Canadian Army overseas are going to match skill and brawn, as they did last year, with the best in Britain when the British Army boxing championships take the stage at Blackpool in March. A team of seven or eight members, one to each class, won't be known for a few weeks because eliminating rounds for the Canadian Army titles are just nicely under way. Where possible, Canadian Army champions will represent their country at Blackpool.

It's always a tough proposition, throwing in a handful of fighters against 300 or so of the cream of British boxing, but from a team of seven at York last March, one, Pte. Bobby Docherty of Toronto's 48th Highlanders, emerged as British Army featherweight king. That made him a double champion because he had taken the Canadian Army feather title a couple of weeks previously. Other Canadian representatives, none of whom reached the finals, were Cpl. Arnold Hayes, Montreal negro heavy-weight; Pte. Bill Hadfield of Aurora, Ontario, middleweight; Rflm. Tom Settee, Indian welterweight from Prince Albert, Sask., and member of Regina Rifles; Cpl. Jack Ennis of Detroit, a lighthweight who enlisted with the 14th Hussars at Windsor, Ont.; Sgmn. Vince Wallace of Montreal, bantamweight, and Pte. Bill Buxton of Victoria, lighthweight, member of the P.P.C.L.I.

The fighter to show the most improvement since then has been Hayes. Defeated in his first bout at the British Army championships, he has since appeared in rings has shown improvement every time out, so much, in fact, that one optimistic London sports writer suggested him as a possible contender for the vacant British heavyweight title. Capt. William McLaws of Bassano, Alberta, is expected to be in charge of the Canadian team, as he was last March at York. A stern disciplinarian where athletes are concerned, McLaws was an outstanding curler back home, as well as excelling at running, soccer and rugby.
