WAR NEWS

INVASION HOUR NEAR?

LONDON — Jan Paquis, military commentator on the Nazi-controlled Paris radio, said last night that the zero hour for an invasion of France is at hand and the invasion stroke commence at any moment.

ANOTHER NAVAL BATTLE

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN SOUTHWEST PACIFIC — Another naval battle in the southwest Pacific is believed to be imminent. Allied reconnaissance planes are reported to have met a strong Japanese force of sixty vessels, including four cruisers—heavy and light—approaching Rabaul.

HITLER'S WORST DEFEAT

LONDON—Adolf Hitler has suffered one of his worst defeats in the war with the loss of Kiev, hub of the southwestern railway system and capital and commercial centre of the Ukraine. The third largest Russian city is now back in Russian hands. Berlin announces its evacuation under the Soviet encirclement more. The Nazis are endeavouring to escape by one narrow corridor to the southwest.

Destroyer is Badly Damaged

OTTAWA, Nov. 6 (CP) — Since the Navy's practice is to announce sinkings rapidly, it can be taken for granted that a Canadian destroyer which was damaged in a recent attack by twenty German bombers off the Spanish coast was not sunk. However, the vessel is believed to have been grievously hurt as the announcement said that a 2,000-pound bomb ripped through the port bulkhead of the signal room and careened out the starboard side, exploding at the water line.

ESCAPED FROM ITALY

CAPE TOWN, Nov. 6 (CP)—Maj.-Gen. H. B. Klapper, who escaped from a prison camp in Italy, has arrived in South Africa, accompanied by Maj.-Gen. Theron, general administrative officer of Union forces in the mid-east.

POST-WAR PEACE

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The United States Senate voted overwhelmingly yesterday in favor of this country participating in an international organization for world peace. The vote was 85 to 5.

LOAN OVER TOP

OTTAWA—The Fifth Victory Loan passed its national objective of \$1,200,000 last night with subscriptions totalling \$1,280,708,000. It was announced Saturday. Quebec was the first to reach its minimum objective with British Columbia second, New Brunswick, third, Manitoba fourth and Alberta fifth.

HAWKHURST, Kent, Eng., Nov. 6—Cmdr. St. John R. J. Tyrwhitt, only son of Admiral of the Fleet Sir Reginald Tyrwhitt, has been awarded the Distinguished Service Order. He accepted surrender of the Italian island of Linosa in June.

Key Bastion of Dneiper River and Old Capital Lost by Nazi Invaders

Red Army Renews Attacks on Both Sides of Kerch Straits in Eastern Crimea in Relentless Drive Westward.

LONDON, November 6 (CP)—Kiev has fallen to the Russians. Premier Joseph Stalin announced today in a special order. The key Dneiper River bastion and ancient capital of the Russians fell to Soviet columns poised north and south of Kiev for weeks.

The German High Command had announced a few hours previously that the great fortress was evacuated with the Nazis pulling out under the threat of encirclement.

The German announcement also said that the Russians had renewed attacks on both sides of Kerch Straits in the eastern Crimea.
