Waterfront Whiffs

Salmon Canning Season Commences Tomorrow Night—Heavy Week Of Halibut Landings

Sockeye fishing opens on the Skeena River tomorrow evening and the canneries and fishermen are now in readiness to start work immediately. Evidently, such difficulties as may have existed have been removed and a smooth opening is expected. Dispatches from Ottawa during the week told of a settlement by agreement on the price situation, there having been some protest by the fishermen at the ceiling. As far as the run itself is concerned, the expectation is that it will be of only medium volume on the Skeena. There have been some signs of sockeyes in the spring nets already.

Halibut landings at Prince Rupert for the 1943 season up to and including yesterday totalled 7,189,400 pounds as compared with 7,480,019 pounds last year at the corresponding date. The Canadian landings for this year now amounted to 3,854,200 pounds in comparison with 2,894,719 pounds while the American landings are 3,335,200 pounds as against 4,585,300 pounds. Landings during the past week, when smaller vessels of the Canadian fleet were landing with the closing of Area No. 2 to fishing, have been heavy at an aggregate of 886,600 pounds of which 371,000 pounds was from American vessels and 515,600 from Canadian. Prices held at good level during the week with 23c and 17c and 16c, the high for Canadian, received by the Svalbard for 7,000 pounds and the low 20c, 17c and 16c which many boats were paid For American fish the top price of the week was 24c and 18c paid the Atlas for 40,000 pounds and the low 20c and 18c which the Kanaga, Eileen and Bonanza received for catches of 47,000, 46,000 and 39,000 pounds respectively.
