

COMMITTEE'S REPLY Editor, Daily News:

It is not the policy of the Carnival Committee to make use of your correspondence columns either to obtain cheap publicity or as media for petty bickering but Harold A. Ponder's attack upon our ethics definitely calls for a reply.

In the first place, we wish to refute Mr. Ponder's statements that "in previous carnivals most of the amusement features and entertainers have been imported" and that "a considerable sum of money goes into the pockets of outsiders." It is true that in recent years we have, with a view to giving the public something they haven't seen dozens of times before, imported a certain amount of entertainment but in 1942, which was the biggest carnival we have staged to date, the amount paid for such entertainment was \$235 or 1.5 per cent of the gross receipts-which, to our way of thinking, does not constitute a very "considerable amount."
