### BIRTHS INCREASE Former Black Hawk IN NETHERLANDS

NEW YORK (P)-Birth rates for the Netherlands have been increasing sharply in the last year, the Netherlands Informa tion Bureau here reports. The current rate of 35.4 per thousand compares with 20.1 per thousand before the war and reflects a large increase in the number of marriages.

The bureau says this birth rate never before was approached in the country. The famine which ravaged the country immediately after the war had its effect in a very low birth rate in large cities, which reported ball history six years ago yesterrate of 14.8 for January, 1946, but that rate has been climbing intil the latest report from the arge cities shows a rate of 38.1 per thousand. 
