After a lay-and-a-half visit here while southbound on the last of three training cruises which she has been making with university cadets, H.M.C.S. Charlottetown sailed yesterday morning for Esquimalt. The Charlottetown, which had been as far north as Ketchikan, had on board this trip a party of some 100 cadets from a Quebec University. On completion of this voyage, the frigate will make some short cruises out of Esquimalt and will be proceeding to Vancouver next month to take part in that city's Diamond Jubilee celebration. An item of interest during the Charlottetown's stay in Prince Rupert this trip was a conducted tour Saturday afternoon of the local Wrenettes over the trim little warship after which the girls were taken for a spin on the vessel's motor cutter. Late Saturday afternoon Commander John Wolfenden and his officers entertained local friends and officials at a reception aboard ship.

C.P.R. steamer Princess Louise, laden with round trip Alaska tourists, the number of whom is increasing each voyage, arrived in port at 7:30 this morning and sailed at 10 a.m. for Skagway and other Alaska points whence she will return here Saturday afternoon southbound.
