ent with me, but how to perform that which is good I find not." He declares himself to be "sold under sin" which is slave market talk, and which describes us all by nature. But now he becomes conscious of an evil nature, which proves that the Holy Spirit is revealing his true condition before the Lord. For that which I am working out, I do not own (as my own choice); for not what I am wishing this am I doing, but what I am hating this am I practicing.

Here he explains the spiritual condition of men who make honest, endless resolutions to be "better" and to "quit" this or that habit but it all ends in failure and despair because of the lack of will power.

My heart consents to God's will and God's way—but in my present awakening I am far from following it, but now I recognize the hindrance, it is sin that dwelleth in me. A hateful power is in possession. Since I am helpless to do what I want to do there must be an evil principle within me "for to will is present with me, but how to perform that which is good I find not." I can will but when faced with my besetting sin, I am overcome by it.

A most humbling confession, but often confession is good for the soul. To appeal to a man's will who is in the grip of some vile habit, to make "a start" and follow Jesus, or some believer upon whom some weight hangs hindering them in their service for the Lord. This is all of no avail unless the will is yielded to the power of the Spirit of God, and the heart illuminated sufficiently to realize that it was sin that caused the suffering of Jesus Christ upon the cross so that instead of defeat there is victory.

It was D. L. Moody who was about to preach to the inmates of a prison and he asked this question: "Has anyone in this audience sinned?" No one would admit they had done any wrong so the great Evangelist said, "So long as no one will admit a fault I cannot help you." No one would own up to the act in their life which brought conviction and a prison term. On the other hand what does Satan care for education, sanitation and general sweetness (and these are certainly needed) if we know nothing about the "power of God unto salvation."

The word of the cross is the will along which runs along no other wire. The Church of God surely needs the power of the Holy Ghost to awaken sinners to the need of a Saviour. It was Rev. C. H. Spurgeon who said, "If I could get the people to spend as much time seeking

God as they do to beautify their bodies I could turn London into a heaven."  
Paul goes on to say, in fact I am by no means wishing what I am practicing. I shed many a tear over this and desire with all my heart it were otherwise. He now comes to a settled conclusion. That he cannot gain victory over sin by his own power, and says, "O wretched man that I am: who shall deliver me?" He does not say "How shall I deliver myself?" but looks for a Deliverer, and he finds the power of deliverance in Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God.

The Gospel believed, that is a full confession of sin and heart surrender made a continued struggle to be at peace with God unnecessary and indeed impossible. It is the refusal to break with some darling sin that causes the conflict in the heart of any believer and keeps them under continued conviction for sin. Who shall deliver me?—Jesus Christ.
