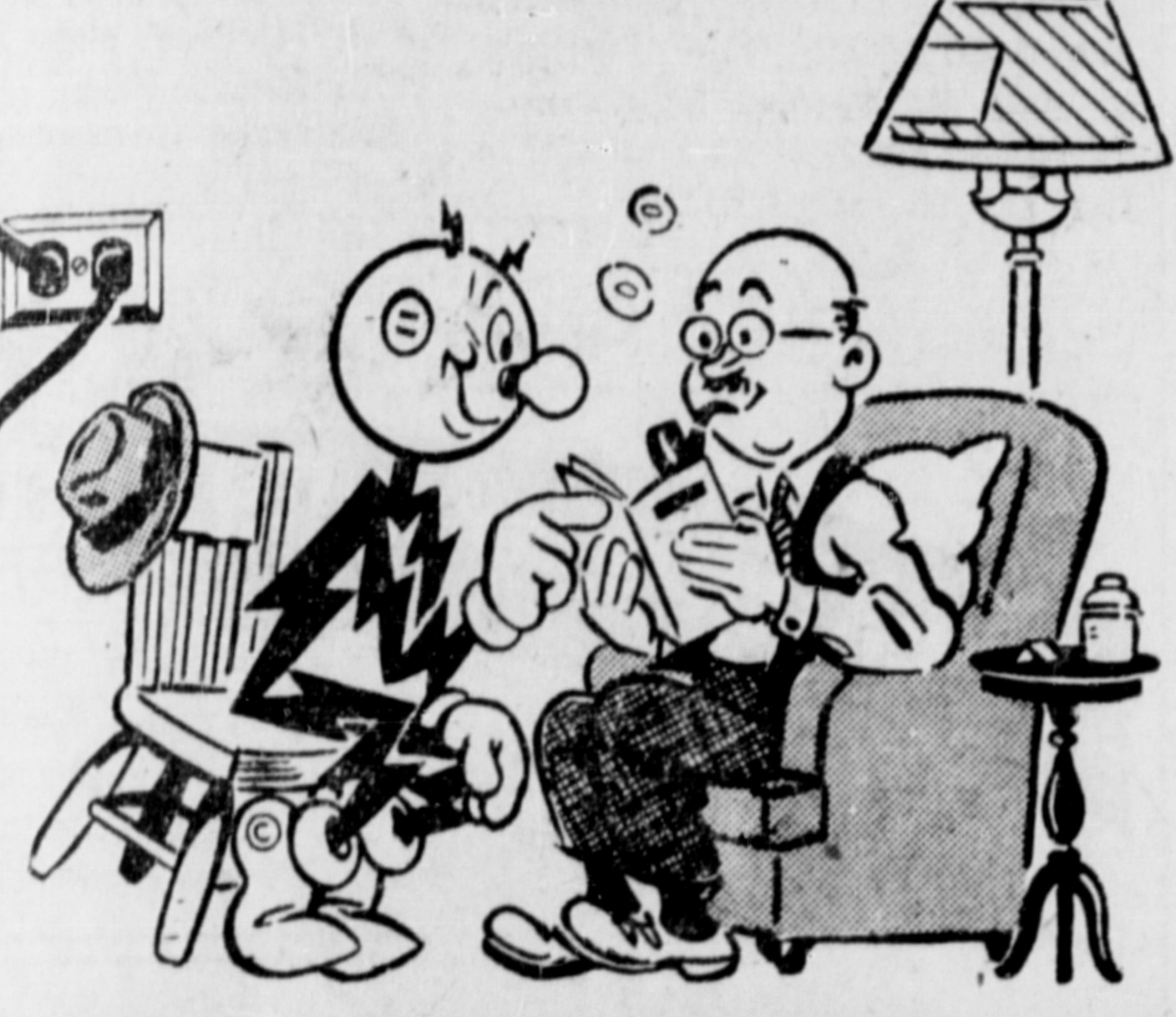
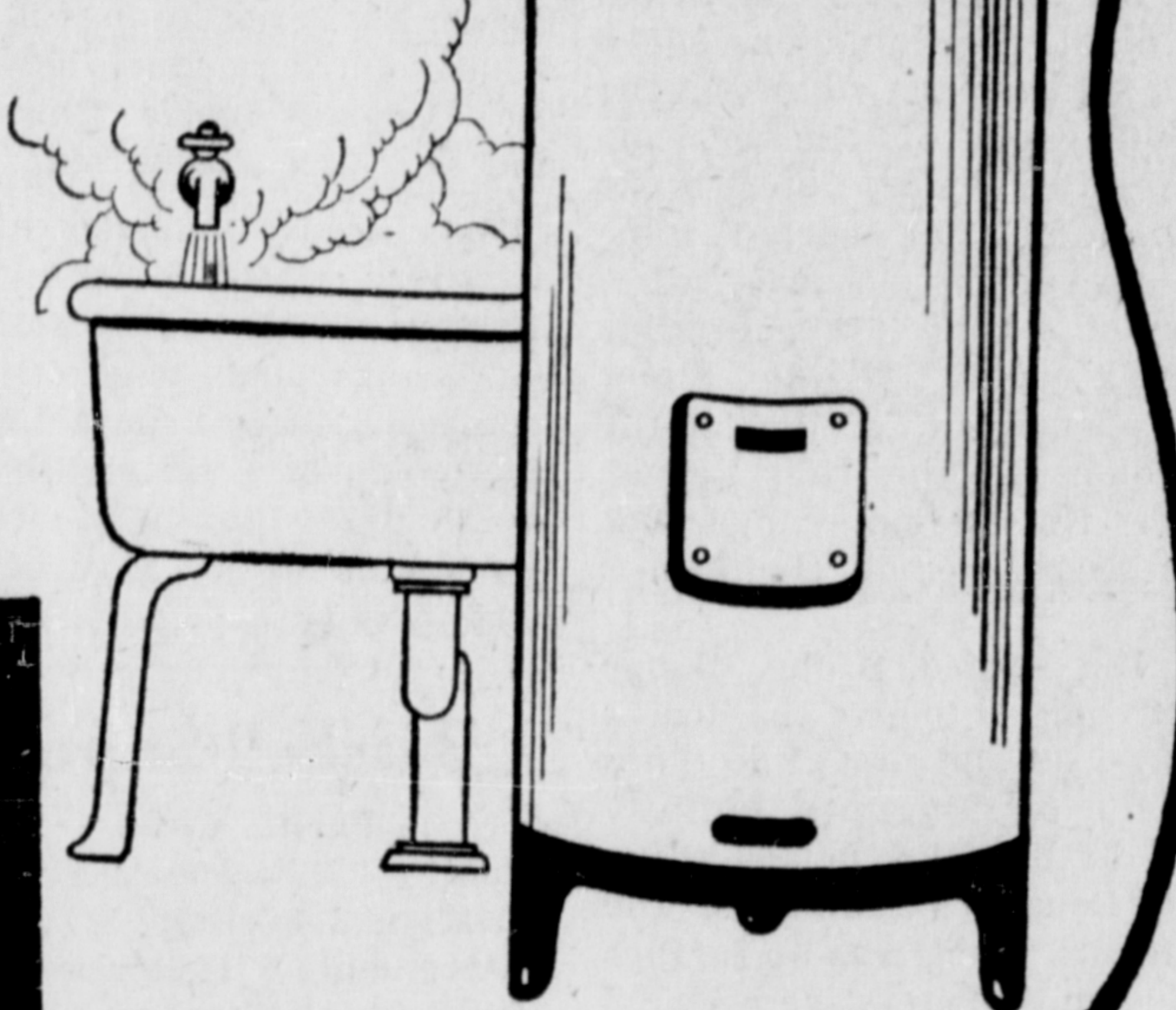

HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I renew old jar lids?
A. Boil in a solution of borax and ivory soap, using three table-spoonfuls of borax and one-third cake of soap to about two gallons of water. Put in just enough lids at a time to be well covered by the water. Boil for thirty minutes, then rinse well with hot water.

Q. How can I drive rats away?
A. Sprinkle a liberal quantity of chloride of lime in the garage, cellar, or other haunts, and the rats will not bother.

Q. How can I clean a leather article?
A. Make a lather of castile soap and cold water. Apply it, and when dry, polish with a soft woolen cloth.
